Saints in the Church's Calendar:

Ss. Peter and Paul, Apostles - Saturday 29th June. On the day traditionally considered by pagan Rome to be its foundation day by Romulus, we celebrate the twin founders of the Church in Rome. St. Peter died by crucifixion and St. Paul by beheading between 64-67. Peter was a fisherman, eventually chosen as the leader of the Twelve, the 'rock' on which the Church was built. Paul, a tentmaker from Tarsus, a Pharisee and a Roman citizen was a persecutor of the first Christians but was converted by the Lord on his way to Damascus. He became the Apostle of the Gentiles. Both of them were chosen to become the pillars of our faith, which they sealed with their martyrdom in Rome.
