Liturgical Calendar Now that the Easter Season is over, we return to the Church's Ordinary Calendar until the December when the Feast of Advent begins. Ordinary Time is about walking with Jesus to Jerusalem and salvation. It is by embracing the dying and rising mystery of Jesus that we receive the life of God within us and renew it each time we celebrate the liturgy. Although much of ordinary Time unfolds during the summer months when many are on holidays, when the heat makes us slow down our pace of life (we hope!), when there is a change in our pace of lives if for no other reason than 'school is out for summer', we must be careful that Ordinary Time doesn't become a temptation to 'holiday' from the demands of faithfully following Jesus.

Parents Prayer – Exam Time. Dear Lord, I pray for my child and all students about to sit exams. Help them to keep calm and clear-minded.
