Parish Pilgrimage to Dundalk and Faughart—Saturday 22nd June



Our annual heritage pilgrimage went off wonderfully last weekend. Our primary goal was Faughart in Co Louth, the birthplace of St Brigid. We visited Dundalk on the way, starting with St Joseph's. After some delicious home-made bread and scones, tea and coffee, the PP, Fr Brendan Callinan, gave a very informative talk on the church and the history of the Redemptorists in the area. We then moved down the road to St Patrick's cathedral, followed by the County Museum which, among many interesting items, had an impressive collection of St Brigid's crosses of various designs. Leaving Dundalk, we drove to the Hill of Faughart where we were met by our guide, Róisín. She explained that St Brigid's birthplace was special, not just for the spectacular views but also because it always has been a key border location on the edge or limit of many divisions. Having visited St Brigid's well we moved on to the national shrine to St Brigid a little further on, down the hill. The shrine is a lovely combination of wooded groves and open grassed areas linked by a stream fed from St Brigid's well. A key feature is the ancient healing stones which can cure all sorts of ailments. We were very lucky that Fr Adrian could join us at this stage and he celebrated mass for us in the oratory at the shrine. All good things come to an end so we had to take our leave and head back to home. But not before stopping off at The Snail Box for a delicious, and very welcome, meal and a chat. We were blessed with the weather and all agreed it had been a great day.

We are already looking forward to next year! We will have some photos on display shortly in the parish centre and on the website.

Saints in the Church's Calendar;

St. Oliver Plunkett—Monday 1st July, He was ordained in Rome in 1654, and appointed Archbishop of Armagh in 1669, when the penal laws were possibly at their worst. He was arrested in 1679 and was taken to London. He was found guilty of high treason 'for promoting the Catholic faith'. He was hanged, drawn and quartered at Tyburn in 1681, the last Catholic to die for his faith at Tyburn. St. Thomas, Apostle - Wednesday 3rd July. Called 'the twin' and is chiefly remembered for doubting the realty of the resurrection until he saw the Lord for himself. Once he was satisfied, he made a heartfelt profession of faith: 'My Lord and my God'. St. Thomas, who probably suffered martyrdom as a result of preaching the Gospel in India, comforts us when our faith is weak. St. Maria Goretti, Martvr - Saturday 6th July Born near Ancona, Italy, to a poor peasant family, St Maria (1890-1902) was known for her hard work, cheerfulness, piety and chastity.
