Statement of Archbishop Dermot Farrell on the Appointment of Monsignor John Kennedy as Archbishop

The Holy See has today announced the appointment by Pope Francis of Monsignor John Kennedy, a Dublin diocesan priest, as titular Bishop of Ossero. Monsignor Kennedy is Secretary of the Disciplinary Section of the Dicastery for the Congregation of the Faith. As Secretary he assists the Prefect in the specific area of his competence.

I warmly welcome the news, and I congratulate Archbishop-elect Kennedy,



and wish him every blessing in his ministry which is directed to the life of the Church, universal and as well as the local. His appointment is a sign of the personal appreciation of Pope Francis for the work of Monsignor Kennedy. John Kennedy was ordained a priest on 13th July 1993 in the Church of St John the Baptist, Clontarf. Following his ordination, he served as a Curate in the

parishes of Crumlin and Francis Street before he was assigned in 1998 to study Canon Law at the Gregorian University in Rome.

Saints in the Church's Calendar

St. John Vianney- Sunday 4th August. 1786-1859, had to contend with poverty, military service and his own intellectual shortcomings in order to become a priest. In 1817, he was sent to care for the people of Ars, a small, obscure French village. The marvellous gift of the unlearned priest for seeing into the depths of the soul brought the world to Ars. Patron of priests.

St. Mary Major – 5th August. The doctrine of Mary, Mother of God, was solemnly proclaimed at the Council of Ephesus (431), and afterwards Pope Sixtus III (432-440) erected a basilica at Rome on the Esquiline Hill in honour of the Holy Mother of God, later to be known as St. Mary Major. This is the oldest church in the west dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

St. Dominic, priest - 8th August 1170-1221, a Spaniard who founded the Order of Preachers (Dominicans) to counteract the Albigensian heresy through instruction and prayer.

St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein) Patron of Europe-9th August – born in 1891 at Wroclaw. A brilliant student, she gained her doctorate in philosophy at twentyfive. After reading the autobiography of St. Teresa of Avila, she became a Catholic in 1922 and eleven years later a Carmelite nun. Both Jewish and Catholic, she fled to Holland when the Nazis came to power but she was captured and sent to Auschwitz where she died on 9th August 1942.

St Lawrence—10th August—died 258. Seen as the cheerful giver since he was one of the seven deacons of the Roman Church in charge of material needs of the faithful. Patron saint of the poor and of cooks.


