Today we come together for a truly incredible celebration of solidarity and unity within our Church— MISSION World Mission Sunday! Today, every single parish worldwide – and YOU – share what you can so the life-transforming work of missionaries overseas can continue. Today, through your prayers and contributions, you are fully appreciating the dedication of our missionaries who live and work in communities that are

struggling and often war-torn. Pope Francis has chosen the theme 'Go and Invite Everyone to the Banquet' (Mt 22:9) for World Mission Sunday 2024. Mission, he said is a tireless going out to all men and women, in order to invite them to encounter God and enter into communion with him. Just as Jesus, the Good Shepherd and Messenger of the Father, went out in search of lost sheep.

We pray and reflect on the mission of the church and our own personal call to mission. World Mission Sunday is a unique effort for the entire church to provide help for over 1,150 mission dioceses, and to offer practical help to the poor and the marginalised, through local Churches and their witness to Christ.

Today's collection will be 60% to the missions 40% to the Common Fund.
